Problem

There is a widespread feeling in the company. It seems, nearly everyone is somehow busy with requirements. The Business Analyst in unit A, the Product Owner in team B and the project manager in her projects C, D and E.

But everyone follows a different plan or process – if any at all.

We trained whole units on their way to achieving a common understanding.

All in all, there were over 200 people we brought to CPRE.



Outcomes
